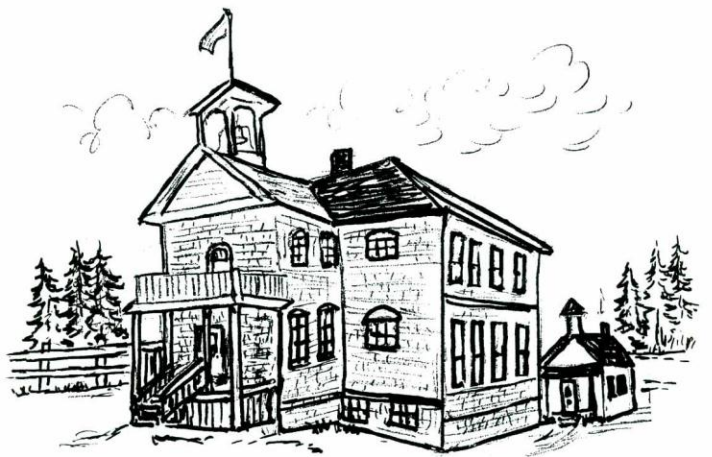


Ira and Susan Woodin arrived in Woodinville in 1871 and built a small cabin. This is their second home, which is no longer there.

The Ira Woodin house was used as a school, Sunday school, and post office.

This house was across the tracks from the road that was called the "Brickyard Road" or Woodinville-Juanita Highway that leaves Hwy 202 going uphill.



When it opened in 1909, Woodinville School was the first brick school east of Lake Washington.

This was the third school on this site donated by the Calkins family. In the back is the one-room school house which served as restrooms.

The school was remodeled by the W.P.A. in the 1930s and an addition was added in 1948, which changed the front view.

When Woodinville became a City, it became City Hall until the new campus was built.
