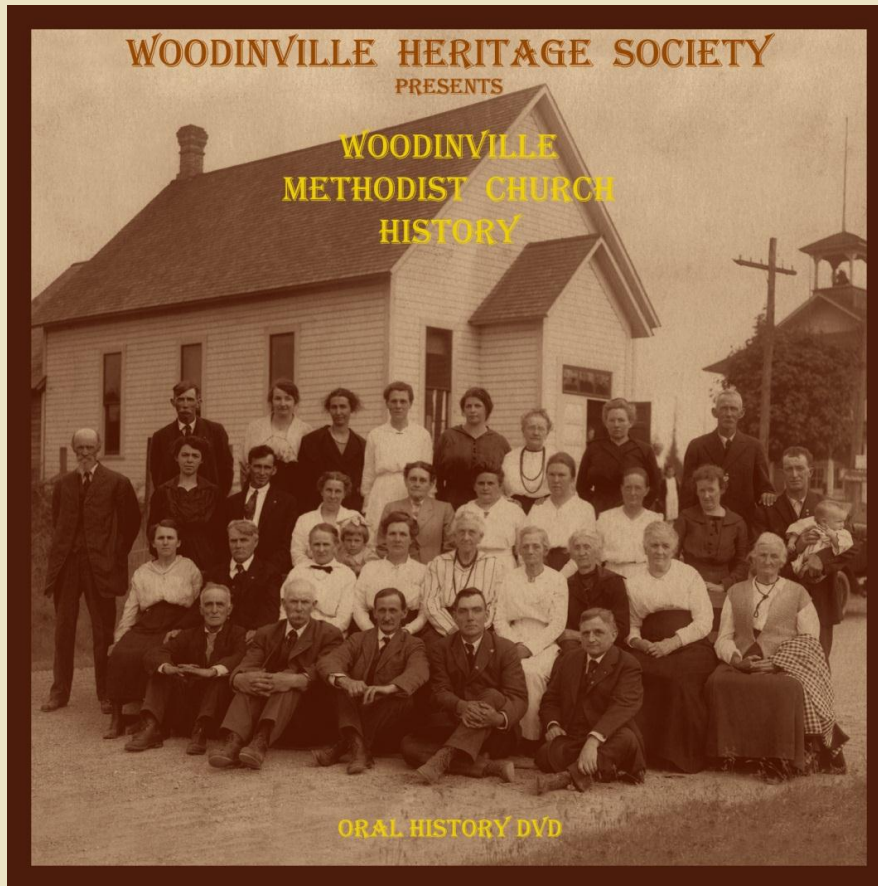


## Life in Woodinville DVD: *Woodinville Methodist Church History*



For many years the Woodinville Methodist Church was the only church in Woodinville. It was one of the cornerstones of the early religious and social life in Woodinville. The first Sunday School classes were held in the Woodin's home in the 1870s long before there was a physical church. Services were later held in a one-room log cabin school located on Gustav Jacobsen's homestead. In 1892, a new one-room school was built on one acre of land donated by the Calkins family. Church services were held here until around 1902 when the first Woodinville Methodist Church (see 1917 cover photo) was built on land donated by the Yamoka family who co-owned the Oriental Trading Company. The church was located across the street from the school on NE 175th Street with the entrance facing the cemetery on 132nd Ave NE. In 1957 a car coming around the corner too fast knocked the Church off of its foundation. This event accelerated the Church's move to its new facility under construction at the time on 140th Ave NE (above photo). In 1966/67 an education wing and a multi-purpose meeting room were added. During 1977/80 a major church expansion was undertaken which included a new 600-seat sanctuary, choir room, baptismal fount for immersion, large foyer/over-flow room, and sound system room. Downstair expansion included seven classrooms, a large fellowship room with kitchen and a Christian Education office.
